HERB: BOTANICAL NAME: Laurus nobilis bay

HARVESTED FROM: purchased from trade technocrats

PARTS USED: drud leaves

CONSTITUENTS/ESSENTIAL OILS: limonene, camphene, acedic and cinemic acids

PREPARATION: simmer slowly
